- Upon return communicate, in a way that is comfortable for you, with BCC congregation. We want the entire congregation to benefit from your experience. We will provide an opportunity for the congregation to hear from you about your experience after your return.

The Bible tells us that God has placed eternity in the hearts of men. Don Richardson introduces us to various examples from cultures around the world of just how true that is. People long for redemption. No matter our color, culture or language, people know that things are not right and they long for redemption in their stories and rituals.

Let the Nations be Glad, John Piper

John Piper introduces you to a stunning new concept of missions. A twist on the tradition "we need to share the gospel so people can go to heaven." John argues that we need to preach the gospel to increase the fame and worship of God. Not only is this an interesting idea, it also makes us more aware of the majesty and grandeur of God.

When Helping Hurts, Steve Corbett and Brian Fikkert

A great study of the way centuries of "helping" has actually hurt. They give great analysis of some of the bad ways we do mission work, and suggest how we can do it better.

The Mission of God's people; a Biblical theology of the Church's Mission - Christopher J.H. Wright

Chris Wright writes pretty deeply. His books are usually well thought out and a bit more "scholarly" than some of the others on this list. But I am sure that if you can stick it out, this book will wake you up to the massive scale of the mission of the church, which is so much larger than most of us imagine.

Suggested Devotional material:

The Practice of the presence of God - Brother Lawrence

This is an old book, a classic. In this excellent, thin and simple book, we learn both the significance and the insignificance (I will let you ponder that) of what we do FOR God. Lawrence helps you to learn what it means to simply enjoy God and live out a Kingdom centered life - No matter what your calling.

Five who Changed the World - Daniel Akin

Five missionaries who sacrificed EVERYTHING are profiled in this book. William Carey, who translated the scriptures into more than forty dialects, and Jm Eliot who **Spoiler Alert** dies for the sake of the gospel are two of the three. These missionary stories will not only motivate you to pursue your calling, but they will also reveal to you a deeper and more magnificent God than most of us tend to believe in.
